THE YEAR IN REVIEW

Since its establishment at Auburn in 1878, the Greek community has instilled values of academic excellence, philanthropy, and servant leadership in thousands of sorority women and fraternity men. Today, about 8,500 students — 36 percent of the undergraduate student body — belong to one of Auburn’s Greek organizations. This report provides an overview of each council and highlights key data for each chapter.

YEAR IN REVIEW



NPHC welcomed Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Inc. back to the council in November.

The **PANHELLENIC COUNCIL** hosted New Member Education Training, an opt-in program for new members focusing on body positivity, mental health, and diversity, equity, and inclusion.

1 In September 2022, the **NATIONAL PAN-HELLENIC COUNCIL (NPHC)** opened the National Pan-Hellenic Council Legacy Plaza, a monument celebrating Black Greek organizations' history, legacy, and cultural impact at Auburn.

The **INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL (IFC)** welcomed Phi Kappa Tau back to the council in October.

PANHELLENIC was selected from a rigorous pool of applicants to receive the Inaugural National Panhellenic Conference Foundation Phi Mu Academic Excellence Grant. This grant will offset costs related to Panhellenic academic excellence programming that supports collegiate sorority women's academic pursuits.

IFC hosted Movember, a month-long men's mental health campaign. Some notable events included a mustache-growing contest, a social media campaign, and concourse days.

PANHELLENIC hosted the National Panhellenic Conference Extension process. While the council decided not to invite a new organization to join the council, great effort went into planning and executing the year-long process.

NPHC received the Lamar Bryant National Pan-Hellenic Council of the Year Award this spring at the Southeastern Greek Leadership Association Conference. This award is given to the council that displays excellence in leadership, philanthropy, community service, and academic achievement. The NPHC was also awarded the Council Impact Award, Operational Excellence Award, Strategic Branding Award, Cross-Council Collaboration Award, Social and Cultural Awareness Award, and Campus and Community Relations Award.



2 Through the annual Greek Sing event held in April, **PANHELLENIC** raised \$170,000 for the Auburn-Opelika Habitat for Humanity. The event proceeds will go toward building three houses in our community.

PANHELLENIC received the Council Impact and Operational Excellence awards this spring at the Southeastern Greek Leadership Association Conference. The Council Impact Award is given to a council that focuses on social and cultural awareness, civic and philanthropy engagement, and campus and community relations. The Operational Excellence Award is given to a council focusing on health, safety, accountability, cross-council collaboration, and strategic branding.



NPHC hosted Black People Meet. The event engaged with 135 students, administrators, professors, and alumni and showcased the essence of Black Auburn and the community in a fun program full of music, food, and games. This event was in collaboration with Black Alumni Weekend.

3 **IFC** donated 7,559 items to the Campus Food Pantry. The IFC chapters donated these items to the food pantry for students facing food insecurity at Auburn University. This was the first food drive the council has hosted, and they plan to make this an annual spring event.

IFC hosted Batting Practice with Butch Thompson for the second consecutive year, a home run derby competition held at Plainsman Park. More than 700 students attended, and the event raised \$4,215 in support of the Hudson Family Foundation.

UNDERSTANDING THE DATA

This report is patterned after the National Fraternity and Sorority Scorecard. Created by the Timothy J. Piazza Center for Fraternity and Sorority Research and Reform, the scorecard aggregates data across member institutions to give a clearer picture of how councils and chapters perform on key indicators. Additionally, the scorecard provides institutions and organizations with the information needed to benchmark local chapters against the national landscape. As a participating member of the National Fraternity and Sorority Scorecard, Auburn updates this report twice annually and it is published in the following spring and fall semesters.

Membership

Membership rosters are submitted by each chapter to Greek Life every semester. The rosters are verified to be Auburn University students.

Academics

All academic information is calculated by the Auburn University Office of Institutional Research using membership rosters provided by the chapters.

For organizations with two or fewer new members, the reported new member grade point average matches the chapter grade point average to ensure confidentiality in the community regarding student grades. The individual chapter receives the comprehensive grade reports.

Conduct

If a chapter is found responsible for violating university policies, a check mark appears under the type of violation — alcohol, hazing, or other. The check mark indicates the organization has been found responsible for violations through the Code of Student Conduct or the Interfraternity Council judicial process. Please note, this report lists organizational misconduct and not individual misconduct.

Definitions for types of violations are as follows:

- Alcohol: Any violation that includes the misuse or distribution of alcohol
- Hazing: Any violation as defined by the Auburn University Hazing Policy
- Other: Any other violations including trespassing, fire/life safety, etc.

Fraternities and sororities suspended from Auburn during the reported semester will appear in this report but will be listed with an asterisk to indicate that they are no longer in good standing with the university. All fraternities and sororities must comply with all requirements of the Greek Life Expansion Policy and any governing council policies to return to campus. Organizations are not guaranteed automatic approval to return after a suspension.

Service and Philanthropy

Philanthropic dollars and service hours are self-reported by each chapter. The data reported corresponds with data provided to organization headquarters.

Not all organizations submitted complete information, and this is indicated in the report as follows:

- Dash (-) indicates no information was submitted.
- Zero (0) indicates that the number zero was submitted.
